

# HEALTH

The Health T Level is a high-quality, work-focussed alternative to A levels for young people once they've completed their GCSEs. The Health T-Level is a 2-year course that has been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses so that the content meets the needs of industry and prepares students for work, further training, or study. T Levels are ideal if you have finished your GCSEs and want the knowledge and experience to get straight into employment, an apprenticeship or higher education. You'll be able to apply academic theory to practice and spend 315 hours (approximately 45 days) on placement with an employer to give you the skills and knowledge within the health sector.

## Specific course entry requirements

To study towards a T-Level at St John Rigby College you will need to have achieved a minimum of five Grade 4s at GCSE. This includes achieving GCSE Mathematics grade 4 or above, English Language (4) or above and Science (4) or above. In addition to the academic requirements described above it is essential all students have Disclosure and Barring Service clearance (DBS) clearance.

## How will I be assessed?

- 2 written exams (paper A & B)
- An employer-set project (ESP) – a supervised project
- End of course exam and observations in a clinical simulation

## What will I study?

The Health T Level comprises core and occupational specialism components which includes working within the health and science sector, providing person centred care, Health and Wellbeing, and managing information and data within the health and science sector. This means that modules of this course include:

- Person Centred Practice
- NHS mission & values
- Infection control & clinical practices
- Safeguarding

## Where will this course lead me?

T Levels will also provide a progression pathway to skilled employment, higher or degree-level apprenticeships and higher-level education. Students who achieve this qualification could progress to adult nursing or other nursing routes, ambulance support worker, healthcare support worker in a health setting or senior healthcare support worker in a health setting.
