

Benefits of Higher Education

- Access to more specialised jobs
 - Building confidence
- Study a subject of interest in more detail
 - Access to state of the art of facilities
- Gain a qualification which is internationally recognised
 - Gain independence
 - Develop transferable skills
 - Making life long connections
 - Enjoy exciting opportunities
- 80% of working graduates were in high-skilled employment (HESA, 2020/21)
- 86.7% employment rate for graduates compared to 70.2% for non graduates
- Increase earning potential median graduate salary was £10,000 more than median nongraduate salary
 - (Graduate labour market statistics, 2021)





Student Finance

OVERVIEW

- University costs £9,250 per year
- Tuition Fee Loan & Maintenance Loan

Only start to pay back once

- Finished university
- Earning over £25,000 per year
- Taken off your monthly wage
- After 40 years of repayment, any left to repay is *written off*

If you earn £30,000:

- Monthly income of £2,500 per month
- You pay £37.50 per month





Disabled Students Allowance

DSA is designed to pay essential extra costs you might have as a direct result of your disability, includes long term health condition, mental health condition or specific learning difficulty, such as dyslexia.

- Receive up to £26,291
- Not Means Tested
- Do not need to pay back.
- Amount eligible to borrow is based on extent of • support required to assist studies, greater financial support for medical assistance, essential equipment etc.
- You will sit down with a needs assessor, and they will support you in figuring out the type of support required





Scholarships

- Universities set their own criteria
- Normally reward excellence or focus on lower income families
- Applications vs guaranteed scholarships
- Can be achieved through a variety of methods:
 - Sport
 - Volunteering
 - Performing Arts
 - A Level/BTEC/ T level grades

- BA (Hons) Criminology and Sociology (50% Criminology, 50% Sociology)
- LLB (Hons) Law with Politics (75% Law, 25% Politics)

Universities may ask for:


- UCAS points or grades

- Certain number of GCSEs or specific subjects

Be realistic with your choices in regards to your grades














Choosing a University

Away

Easier to meet people and get involved in university life

• Experience independent living

• Need to consider your accommodation options and research





Student Support

Care leavers- dedicated contact, bursaries, accommodation

Wellbeing and counselling - if you're feeling anxious or finding university difficult

Disability Support - individually tailored support

SpLD Team - advice, guidance, support and assessment for students with Specific Learning Difficulties

Transitions - help you to succeed and stay on track at university, personally and or academically

Chaplaincy- for pastoral guidance and support for multiple faiths or those of no faith

Careers - PT jobs, summer, volunteering, future careers

Money Advice - budgeting, financial health checks, student funding






