You'll study climate change, renewable energy, ethical consumption, and global justice, gaining critical thinking skills and practical experience to lead change in your community, career, or further studies.

Specific course entry requirements

College entry applies. Please refer to the website for full details. A minimum of 4,4 in Science is preferred but not required.

How will I be assessed?

Assessment combines theory and practical work:

- Exam (50%) – Covers key sustainability knowledge
- Coursework (50%) – Applied assignment investigating real-world sustainability

This one-year qualification is equivalent to half an A Level and fits alongside three A Levels or a mixed A Level/AAQ programme.

What will I study?

F227: Fundamentals of Sustainability (Exam)

Explore the three pillars of sustainability: environmental, economic, and social, and how they interconnect.

F228: Sustainability in Practice (Coursework)

Investigate how organisations adopt sustainable practices. Learn research methods, analyse data, and make recommendations.

You will gain skills for careers such as:

- Environmental Auditor
- Carbon Accountant
- Recycling or Waste Management Officer

You can also progress to degrees like:
